



The Cathedral School of St Peter and St John RC Primary School Uniform Policy including games and P.E

Key Principles

A school uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of our school and helps set an appropriate tone. It helps to instil pride, supports positive behaviour, ensures consistency between pupils and adds to a vibrant atmosphere at The Cathedral School of St Peter and St John RC Primary. By creating a common identity amongst all pupils, regardless of background, a school uniform can act as a social leveller. It can reduce peer pressure to wear the latest fashions or other expensive clothes.

The Cathedral School of St Peter and St John RC Primary has considered these key principles when setting a uniform policy.

Our policy:

1. The logo on the sweatshirt or cardigan gives the pupils a sense of belonging
2. Allows parents the option to source uniform from high street suppliers/supermarkets
3. Supports parents who are experiencing financial difficulties when providing uniform for their children, including making second-hand uniform items available.
4. Correct footwear ensures that the children are comfortable throughout the day
5. We will ensure that we listen to and consider any individual requests for adjustments to the policy. Each case will be considered on its own merits.

General Uniform Rules

- All pupils must wear school uniform - Items of Jewellery should not be worn (only small stud earrings will be permitted and will need to be removed if the pupils go swimming. Wrist watches may be worn – no smart watches please
- Please do not allow children to have inappropriate hairstyles, i.e. shaved or lines/patterns shaved into the hair.
- All Long hair must be tied back for safety and hygienic reasons
- Nail varnish or false nails are not permitted

- All shirts should be tucked into trousers/skirts.
- A sensible coat with a hood must be worn in the winter months/poor weather.

What should my child wear?

White polo Shirt

Royal Blue sweatshirt – with school’s logo (ordered from the school office) paid for via parent pay.

Grey /black tailored trousers – no leggings

Black/grey skirt/pinafore

Black /grey /white socks/tights

Sensible Black Shoes – no trainers to be worn apart for PE– Velcro for any child who has not yet mastered tying laces.

Summer dresses (Light Blue Gingham Dress)

Tailored shorts grey or black

PE Kits

P.E. kits are only required from Y1 to Y6. If an optional kit is not purchased, children should wear plain black shorts, a plain white t-shirt – no logos or markings of any kind and black pumps.

These must be kept in a school in the drawstring PE bag and only taken home at the end of each half term.

Outside sports take place throughout the year, therefore we encourage children to wear a plain tracksuit/hoodie or sweatshirt to keep warm in the colder months.

No club/country football shirts or tops are permitted to be worn.

School Bags

All children should have a Blue School book Bag (available from the office). and or PE draw string bag.

Only Yr 5 and Y6 children are permitted to bring in their own bag to carry the additional books associated with this year group.

Home packed lunches should be in a typical packed lunch bag – these will keep the food fresher for longer.
