Salford's International Women's Day Event

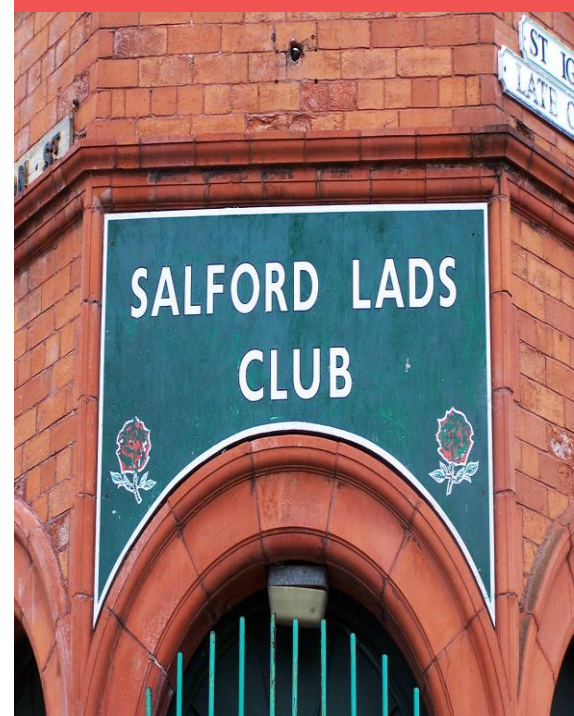
We were thrilled some of our female colleagues from counter terrorism policing could be a part of Salford's International Women's Day Event for young women aged 11-21.

Training

We were lucky to be able to deliver four core training offers in Salford throughout the last year.

WRAP - Workshop to Raise Awareness of Prevent

WRAP covers what Prevent is, how to spot signs of radicalisation and how to make a referral in Salford.

Number of people trained: **235**

Understanding the Threat of Incel Violence

Responding to a recent increase in Incel ideology the team and CT policing deliver training to keep professionals informed about this area of counter terrorism. This training has been very popular and is usually fully booked each month.

Number of people trained: **248**

Small Steps

Small Steps training is delivered monthly in Salford. This session is led by a member of Exit UK who was previously a member of the far right.

Number of people trained: **311**

How to Talk about Andrew Tate – Lunchtime Learning

This training explores why Andrew Tate has become so popular to young people and how we should talk about him.

It's aim was to promote how Prevent fits into GMCA's contextual safeguarding structures by promoting;

- What Prevent is and does in relation to contextual safeguarding
- Why Prevent is needed in contextual safeguarding structures
- How Prevent fits into contextual safeguarding within local authorities
- How we can work better together
- To breakdown preconceived barriers to engaging with Prevent.

The programme of events consisted of A range of speakers giving a local, regional and national perspective on Prevent continuing with a range of workshops on

- Radicalisation and Autism
- Online Safety
- Mixed/ Unclear/ Unstable Ideology
- International Terrorism
- How to Build Resilience and Safeguard Young People from Extremism.

Over 130 professionals participated in the event from a range of agencies such as, GMP, GMFRS, schools and education services, safeguarding teams and youth services.
